This sampler is inspired by antique needlework, alphabet booklets and other vintage pieces.

It features a famous quotation accredited to John Adams the 2nd president of the United States.

"Always stand on principle. Even if you stand alone "


There is a space where you can personalize your sampler with the name and date of your choice. An extra chart with an alphabet and numeral is included in the PDF.

Apart for the mermaid, the rest of the sampler is not charted in color, this is done so that you can chose according to your preference, or what you have available in your stash. Variegated threads, hand-dyed floss, metallics or even beads can be used to stitch the alphabets and borders.

Have fun being creative with this beautiful sampler.

Stitches used are: Cross stitch, back stitch, running stitches (also known as Holbein stitch), French knots and petit point.

Recommended to stitch on 28 ct linen, or evenweave.



Design Area: 155 x 272 stitches

If stitched on 28 ct linen/ 14 ct aida the pattern will measure: 11,07" x 19,42" / 28,1 x 49,3 cm

Backstitch Lines

DMC Cotton 317 - Fish border DMC Cotton 310 – Mermaid details.

We suggest stitching this sampler on 28 ct linen with two threads of embroidery floss for the cross stitch and petit point, and one thread for the backstitch.

For the backstitch on the mermaid, use a sharp needle, take your time and only begin once you are finished with the cross stitch and petit point.

<u>Tips</u>

The alphabet would look amazing if stitched in different colors or in variegated threads.

Why not substitute DMC 3325 with DMC variegated 4230.

And DMC 317 with DMC variegated 4240

If you are not comfortable with petit point, you can just stitch in regular cross stitch and pay careful attention when working the backstitch.

This pattern is a modern take on the traditional sampler, it has classic features such as antique alphabets, decorative borders and a quotation.







Here you can see the different pieces that were the inspiration for this sampler, from my own sketch to an antique stitched letter, booklets, and pretty DMC embroidery cottons.


As often is the case with older alphabets, the letters 'I', and 'W' were missing from the patterns used for this design. So, I took the creative liberty to supplement the alphabets with the missing letters by adapting them from the others such as 'V' for 'W'.





































































Details of the mermaid using only whole stitches




Photo of a stitched sampler, March 2025
